What's Next?

• Advising Questionnaire: As part of the incoming first-year student checklist, all new students must complete the First-Year Advising Questionnaire. The information submitted by YOU, the student, will be shared with the Advising Support Center and your faculty advisor. Your assigned faculty advisor will also be the instructor of your Discovery Seminar (DS 101Q) course. Faculty advisors are trained to work with all students, regardless of potential majors, and they will serve as one part of your advising network at Oxford College and Emory.

During your time at Oxford, your faculty advisor is trained to guide you through the general education program, offer advice and suggestions for academic resources, and support all of your endeavors here. The information you provide in the questionnaire will help your advisor prepare to better assist you as you work together. You will have the opportunity to meet your assigned advisor during New Student Orientation in August.

The deadline to submit your questionnaire is July 15. Please answer ALL questions and be honest with your answers!

• Orientation: Move-in will take place on Friday, August 20, and the New Student Orientation program will begin after move-in and continue through August 24. A detailed schedule for students will be provided later in the summer as gathering plans and guidelines are finalized. We anticipate being able to welcome parents and families to campus for move-in on August 20, and they will depart at the end of the day. Updates will be posted on the <u>Welcome Website</u> throughout the summer.

- **Required Health Forms:** Please remember that the deadline to complete your required health forms is July 1. All forms must be completely filled out with appropriate signatures and uploaded to your **<u>Patient Portal</u>** by this date. For more information, please visit the Student Health Services page of the Welcome Website.
- Final High School Transcript: Please be sure your high school submits your final transcript to the Office of Admission when it's available. We understand that some school districts do not release transcripts until mid-July. Check your **Emory applicant portal** to see if it's been received. Remember, official transcripts must be submitted by your school, not by you as the student.
- Install Recommended Software: Install Microsoft Office (including Word, Excel, PowerPoint, OneNote, and Teams). You may download five copies of Microsoft Office Suite. Log in to Zoom and install the client for hosting/attending online classes and meetings.
