 Canvas: By now, all incoming students should have logged in (with your NetID and Password) to the <u>Emory Essentials Oxford Edition Canvas Course</u>. If you have not logged in to Canvas, be sure to check your Emory email for the course invitation. Students must complete the content in Modules 1 and 2 by July 1. New content will launch in July!

Content in these modules provide a detailed overview of Oxford College's General Education Program, academic resources, and information to help students prepare for class registration. Additional content has also been provided for specific placement exams (First-Year Writing, Mathematics, and Arabic), pre-professional advising materials, and other helpful campus resources. Be sure to follow the new student checklist on the <u>Welcome</u> <u>Website</u> for updates and important deadlines. The priority deadline for all placement exams is August 1.

All students must complete these modules to be deemed eligible to attend a large group course planning session hosted by the Advising Support Center. Large group course planning sessions will review important parts of the registration process, and they will be held throughout the entire month of July and continue into early August. The schedule for these will be posted in Module 2 in the very near future.

As an added incentive, students who complete Modules 1 and 2 are also eligible to sign up for optional individual advising meetings hosted by the Advising Support Center. Individual meetings are first come, first served. Sign up at <u>oxford.emory.edu/ASCBooking</u>.

• **Discovery Seminars:** We hope you have already visited <u>this page</u> to learn about the Discovery Seminar (DS) every first-year student will take in the fall and are getting excited about your options. There are 39 excellent courses on a wide range of topics for the fall!

Remember that you need to submit your preference form to rank your top choices of DS courses by July 15. If you do not submit your preferences by the July 15 deadline, you will be randomly assigned to a course with open seats.

- Housing Assignments: We expect to release housing assignments beginning July 15. Students will be able to see their Fall 2021 housing assignments by logging in to their <u>MyHousing account</u>. Have questions about housing? Please contact Residential Education & Services at <u>RES@emory.edu</u>.
- **First-Year Writing:** Based on student feedback, this year's First-Year Writing placement has been streamlined and redesigned to provide both information on the Writing Program more broadly and a placement recommendation. All students, regardless of language background or exemption credit, are required to take the FYW Directed-Self Placement questionnaire by August 1. This will help you make the best placement decision for your learning needs and orient you to First-Year Writing and Continuing Writing as well as other opportunities to develop yourself as a writer while at Oxford.

The questionnaire should take 10-15 minutes to complete, so cross it off your to-do list today! Note that your recommendation and some of your answers will be provided to your advisor and your FYW instructor to help them get to know you as a writer and provide a concrete reference point for conversations with you about your reading, research, and writing experiences. If you choose to upload an optional academic writing sample from high school, this will also be shared. Learn more about the process on the <u>Placement Testing page</u> and find the questionnaire in Canvas.


