- **EmoryCard:** EmoryCard, the official identification card of Emory University, provides secure, convenient, and efficient access to events, goods, and services all through one card.

Prior to August 1, all first-year students are required to upload a photo using "MyPhoto," the EmoryCard Services' [online photo submission tool](#). Your card will be produced and distributed to you at move-in or during your school/program orientation.

- **Advising Questionnaire:** As part of the incoming first-year student checklist, all new students must complete the [First-Year Advising Questionnaire](#). The information submitted by YOU, the student, will be shared with the Advising Support Center and your faculty advisor. Your assigned faculty advisor will also be the instructor of your Discovery Seminar (DSC 101Q) course. Faculty advisors are trained to work with all students, regardless of potential majors, and they will serve as one part of your advising network at Oxford College and Emory.

During your time at Oxford, your faculty advisor is trained to guide you through the general education program, offer advice and suggestions for academic resources, and support all of your endeavors here. The information you provide in the questionnaire will help your advisor prepare to better assist you as you work together. You will have the opportunity to meet your assigned advisor during New Student Orientation in August.

Submission is also encouraged before attending Large Course Planning Sessions hosted by the Advising Support Center (scheduled to take place July 6- August 6). A detailed schedule of pre-registration programs can be found in Module 2 of the Emory Essentials Oxford Edition Canvas course.

The deadline to submit your questionnaire is July 15. Please answer ALL questions and be honest with your answers!

- **Discovery Seminars:** Every first-year student will enroll in a [Discovery Seminar \(DSC 101Q\)](#) in the fall semester as the first step in Oxford's signature general education curriculum focused on Discovery, Exploration, and Reflection.

Through a process of ranking your preferences, you will be registered for a Discovery Seminar prior to your arrival on campus in August. By July 15, you must complete the [Discovery Seminar preference form](#) to rank the courses that most interest you. *Note: If you do not complete this preference form by July 15, you will be placed into a Discovery Seminar with an open seat.*

- **Survey:** On July 14, you will be receiving a reminder from the Office of Undergraduate Affairs to complete The Beginning College Survey of Student Engagement (BCSSE). BCSSE is a national survey conducted by Indiana University Center for Postsecondary Research and provides an opportunity for you to share your expectations for your upcoming experiences at Emory University.

Results from this survey will be helpful both in better understanding and enhancing the undergraduate college experience. Thank you in advance for your participation in this important project!
