- Canvas:** By now, all incoming students should have logged in (with your NetID and Password) to the [Emory Essentials Oxford Edition Canvas Course](#). If you have not logged in to Canvas, be sure to check your Emory email for the course invitation. Students must complete the content in Modules 1 and 2 by July 1. New content will launch in July!

Content in these modules provide a detailed overview of Oxford College's General Education Program, academic resources, and information to help students prepare for class registration. Additional content has also been provided for specific placement exams (First-Year Writing, Mathematics, and Arabic), pre-professional advising materials, and other helpful campus resources. Be sure to follow the new student checklist on the [Welcome Website](#) for updates and important deadlines. The priority deadline for all placement exams is August 1.

Essentials Oxford Edition Canvas course. We also encourage Spring Start students to begin completing the process for placement exams (priority deadline is August 1). An additional module for Spring Start will be added in the near future, and it will include more information to help you prepare for your transition to Oxford in the spring. - Required Health Forms:** There was an error regarding this deadline in the most recent edition of your Eagle Updates. The deadline to complete your required health forms is October 1. All forms must be completely filled out with appropriate signatures and uploaded to your [Patient Portal](#) by this date. - First-Year Writing:** Based on student feedback, this year's First-Year Writing placement has been streamlined and redesigned to provide both information on the Writing Program more broadly and a placement recommendation. All students, regardless of language background or exemption credit, are required to take the FYW Directed-Self Placement questionnaire by August 1. This will help you make the best placement decision for your learning needs and orient you to First-Year Writing and Continuing Writing as well as other opportunities to develop yourself as a writer while at Oxford.

The questionnaire should take 10-15 minutes to complete, so cross it off your to-do list today! Note that your recommendation and some of your answers will be provided to your advisor and your FYW instructor to help them get to know you as a writer and provide a concrete reference point for conversations with you about your reading, research, and writing experiences. If you choose to upload an optional academic writing sample from high school, this will also be shared.
